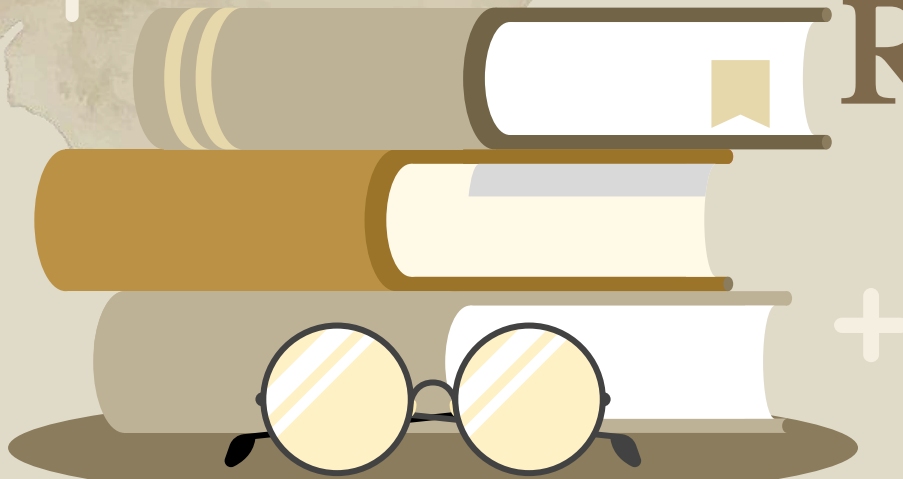

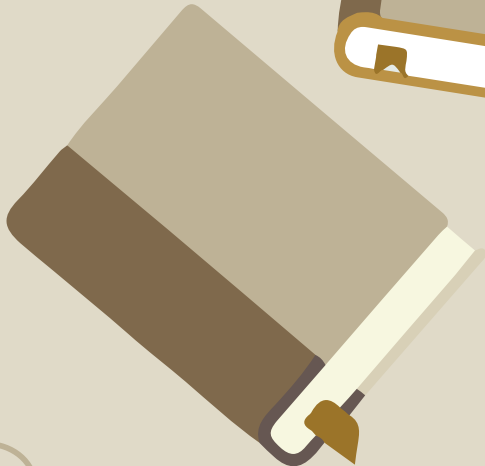

LLS-3031/3032

College Anatomy & Physiology

1.0 Science Elective credit, lab science

Prerequisite-Biology or AP Biology

Open to grades 11-12

Chemistry is strongly recommended. Recommended for students who have a special interest in pursuing a nursing or medical career.

The course is designed to introduce students to essential concepts in anatomy and physiology, including basic chemistry, cell and tissue studies, and an overview of all the body systems. Students are introduced to scientific thinking and provided with a strong foundation in anatomy and physiology.

Students will perform anatomy lab and dissections.

Great foundational college course for students planning on Health Science related major in college. Full year counts for 5 college credits.

Newer Courses to Consider

CTS-3090

Introduction to Athletic Training

0.5 Elective Credit

Prerequisite: Health Careers I, Principles of BioMed, Human Body Systems, or Anatomy & Physiology

Introduces athletic training and basic principles of preventative care. Explore the role of the athletic trainer in sports medicine, mechanisms of athletic injuries, tissue response to injury, blood-borne pathogens, introductory techniques of the assessment and evaluation of athletic injuries and emergency procedures. This course may require hours of internship.

1.0 Elective Credit, recommendation by counselor or teacher
