Project C.A.R.

Sioux Area Metro (SAM)

Public transportation serving Sioux Falls. Transit service is available on most routes from 5:45am - 8:45pmpm, Monday -Friday and from 7:45am to 6:45pm, Saturday. Daily, weekly, and monthly passes are available.
